### NOTICE OF ELECTION

### TO THE RESIDENT, QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF PORT ISABEL, TEXAS:

TAKE NOTICE that an election will be held in Port Isabel, Texas on November 8, 2022, as provided in an ORDINANCE CALLING AN ELECTION duly passed by the City Commission of said City on August 16, 2022 which Ordinance is substantially as follows:

### ORDINANCE NO. 08-16-2022-01

AN ORDINANCE ORDERING A BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE 8TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 2022, IN THE CITY OF PORT ISABEL, TEXAS; MAKING PROVISION FOR THE HOLDING OF THE ELECTION; AND RESOLVING OTHER MATTERS RELATED THERETO

**WHEREAS**, the City Commission of the City of Port Isabel, Texas (the "City") desires to call a bond election for November 8, 2022 (the "Election") and finds that the Election is in the public interest;

WHEREAS, the governing bodies of one or more other local political subdivisions situated in Cameron County, Texas (the "County"), also intend to call an election for November 8, 2022, and certain of such entities, and the City, wish to hold a joint election as permitted by the provisions of Section 271.002, Texas Election Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City (the "City Commission") hereby finds that the Election should be held to determine whether the City Commission shall be authorized to issue bonds of the City in the amounts and for the purposes hereinafter identified and that the Election should be held jointly with the County and all other local political subdivisions choosing to participate (together, the "Participants");

# NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PORT ISABEL, TEXAS THAT:

**Section 1.** The Election shall be held on Tuesday, the 8th day of November, 2022, in accordance with the laws of Texas and the provisions of the Charter of the City (the "City Charter"), and the official ballots for the Election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code and at the Election the following PROPOSITIONS shall be submitted in accordance with law:

# STREET & DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS

# PROPOSITION A

"Shall the City Commission of the City of Port Isabel, Texas, be authorized to issue bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$1,260,000 for the purpose of making permanent public improvements for public purposes, to wit, providing street and drainage improvements, including necessary expenditures incidental thereto (e.g. replacing or relocating utility lines, lighting, installing curbs and gutters, technology improvements, signage, acquiring land and rights-of-way, and sidewalks), such improvements all related to the following: Laguna Heights and Garcia Streets, and in providing for such public

improvements, the City Commission shall have the option to utilize other funds available for such purposes and, after making due provision for such improvements, the City Commission may, in its discretion, use any excess funds for constructing other street or drainage improvements, including necessary expenditures incidental thereto (e.g. replacing or relocating utility lines, lighting, technology improvements, signage, acquiring land and rights-of-way, and sidewalks), such bonds to mature serially or otherwise not more than 40 years from their issued date; and any issue or series of said bonds to bear interest at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable, or otherwise) as may be determined within the discretion of said City Commission; provided, however, that such interest shall not exceed the maximum rate per annum authorized by law at the time of the issuance of any issue or series of said bonds; and shall the City Commission be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity and to pay the costs of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds?"

### PARKS AND RECREATION

#### PROPOSITION B

"Shall the City Commission of the City of Port Isabel, Texas, be authorized to issue bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$1,740,000 for the purpose of making permanent public improvements for public purposes, to wit, the design, construction, acquisition, repair, or renovation of park facilities, including necessary expenditures incidental thereto, such improvements related to the Laguna Madre Park and the Laguna Madre Youth Center Recreation Building, including construction of additional fields, parking, and access roads; and in providing for such public improvements, the City Commission shall have the option to utilize other funds available for such purposes and, after making due provision for such improvements, the City Commission may, in its discretion, use any excess funds for the design, construction, acquisition, repair, or renovation of other City park facilities, including necessary expenditures incidental thereto, such bonds to mature serially or otherwise not more than 40 years from their issued date; and any issue or series of said bonds to bear interest at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable, or otherwise) as may be determined within the discretion of said City Commission; provided, however, that such interest shall not exceed the maximum rate per annum authorized by law at the time of the issuance of any issue or series of said bonds; and shall the City Commission be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity and to pay the costs of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds?"

**Section 2.** The official ballots for the Election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid PROPOSITIONS, with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings, and language as required by law, and with such PROPOSITIONS to be expressed substantially as follows:

**Section 3.** In accordance with Section 3.009, Texas Election Code, the City Commission makes the following disclosures:

- (a) The respective proposition language is set forth in Section 1;
- (b) The purposes for which the Bonds are to be authorized are stated in Section 1;
- (c) The total principal amount of the Bonds to be authorized is \$3,000,000.00;
- (d) Ad valorem taxes sufficient to pay the annual principal and interest on the Bonds will be imposed;
- (e) The maximum interest rate of the Bonds or any series of the Bonds is estimated to be 5.000%, based on the market conditions at the time of this Ordinance;
  - (f) The maximum maturity date of the Bonds shall not exceed 40 years;
- (g) The aggregate amount of the outstanding principal of the City's ad valorem tax debt obligations as of the beginning of the City's fiscal year in which the Election is ordered being the year ended September 30, 2022 (the "Fiscal Year") is \$5,705,000.00;
- (h) The aggregate amount of the outstanding interest on ad valorem tax debt obligations of the City as of the beginning of the Fiscal Year is \$9,329,665.00; and

- (i) The ad valorem tax debt service tax rate for the City at the time the Election is ordered is \$.0729 per \$100 valuation of the taxable property.
- **Section 4.** The City Commission hereby authorizes the Election to be held jointly with other participating political subdivisions located within the County, and authorizes the execution of an agreement with the County, acting through its Elections Administrator, for conduct of the Election as a joint election with the other political subdivisions identified in such agreement.

Pursuant to Section 61.012, Texas Election Code, the Cameron County Elections Administrator shall provide at least one accessible voting system in each polling place used in the Election. Such voting system shall comply with Texas and federal laws establishing the requirements for voting systems that permit voters with physical disabilities to cast a confidential or secret ballot.

- **Section 5.** Said election shall be held in and throughout the City of Port Isabel, Texas, on November 8, 2022 (the "Election Day"), between the hours of 7:00 am and 7:00 pm. Election Day voting locations are listed in Exhibit A.
- **Section 6.** Early voting by personal appearance will begin on October 24, 2022 and end on November 4, 2022. Early voting locations and hours are listed in Exhibit B.
- **Section 7.** Electors may cast their early vote by mail, and the early voting clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail shall be sent to, is as follows:

- **Section 8.** (a) Notice of such bond election shall be given by posting a copy of this Ordinance, both in English and in Spanish, at three (3) public places in the City and also at the City Hall, not less than 21 days prior to the date set for the Election; and a substantial copy of this Ordinance also shall be published, both in English and in Spanish, on the same day in each of two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation published in the City, the date of the first publication to be not less than 10 nor more than 30 days prior to the date set for the Election.
- (b) On Election Day and during early voting by personal appearance, the Ordinance shall be posted in a prominent location at each polling place.
- (c) During the 21 days before the election, the Notice of Election and the Ordinance shall be posted prominently on the City's Internet website.

At least 63 days prior to the scheduled Election Day, the City Commission, or the designees thereof, will identify and formally approve the appointment of the Presiding Judge, Alternate Presiding Judges, Election clerks, and all other election officials for the Election, together with any other necessary changes to election practices and procedures, and can correct, modify, or change the Exhibits to this Ordinance based upon the final location and times agreed upon by the Elections Administrator, the City, and the Participants.

(b) Voting machines may be used in holding and conducting the Election on Election Day; provided, however, that if the use of voting machines is not practicable, then in that event, electronic voting devices may be used in conducting the Election on Election Day; provided however, in the event the use of such electronic voting devices is not practicable, the Election may be conducted on Election Day by the use of paper ballots. Voting machines, electronic voting devices, or paper ballots may be used for Early Voting by personal appearance. Paper ballots may be used for Early Voting by mail. The City may also utilize a Central Counting Station (the "Station") as provided by Section 127.000, et seq., Texas Election Code. The Elections Administrator is hereby appointed as the Manager and as Presiding Judge of the Station and may appoint Station clerks and establish a written plan for the orderly operation of the Station in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code. The City hereby appoints the Elections Administrator as Tabulation Supervisor. Lastly, the City, Elections Administrator, or the agent thereof, will publish notice and conduct instruction testing on the automatic tabulation equipment relating to the Station and conduct instruction for the officials and clerks for the Station in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code. The City will provide at least one accessible voting system in each polling place that complies with state and federal laws setting the requirements for voting systems that permit voters with physical disabilities to cast a secret ballot.

The Presiding Judges shall appoint not less than two resident qualified voters of the City to act as clerks. The appointment of these clerks must include a person fluent in the Spanish language to serve as clerk to render oral aid in the Spanish language to any voter desiring such aid at the polls on Election Day. If the Presiding Judge appointed actually serves, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall serve as one of the clerks. In the absence of the Presiding Judge, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall perform the duties of the Presiding Judge of the election precinct.

**Section 9.** All resident qualified electors of the City shall be permitted to vote at the Election and on the day of the Election. Such electors shall vote at the designated polling places. The Election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code, the City Charter, and the Federal Voting Rights Act and the provisions of the Texas Government Code, and as may be required by any other law. All election materials and proceedings shall be printed in both English and Spanish.

**Section 10.** If for any reason any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance, for it is the definite intent of the City Commission that every section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision hereof be given full force and effect for its purpose.
