EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ORDER EXTENDING MANDATORY COUNTYWIDE SHELTER IN PLACE WITH LIFTING OF CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS

The First Amended Emergency Management Order with Mandatory Countywide Shelter in Place has been extended until May 4, 2020, at 11:59 p.m. with the lifting of certain restrictions.

Effective today, April 20, 2020, and in guidance of the CDC and State and Local Health Authorities to determine the best and safest practices to reopen businesses and the economy of Cameron County, the Emergency Management Order Extending Mandatory Countywide Shelter in Place with Lifting of Certain Restrictions has been issued.

Every resident of and visitor to Cameron County must read and familiarize themselves with the most recent order.

In collaboration with Cameron County Elected Officials and the recently appointed Cameron County Advisory Task Force, further modifications of restrictions will be taken under the guidance and input from federal, state and local and health authorities.

"Thank you to everyone who has followed the Orders up until now. The sacrifices you have made over the past several weeks have made it possible so that we may start considering how and when to reopen our local businesses and restart our economy. Your continued cooperation is necessary to combat and slow the spread of the virus. We will monitor the number of positive cases daily and will respond as needed," stated Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr.
