CAMERON COUNTY EMPLOYEES TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

Today, July 30, 2021, the Office of Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr., has been notified that two (2) employees from the District Attorney's Office, and one (1) employee from the County Clerk's Office have tested positive for COVID-19. Due to privacy laws, Cameron County will not release specific employee information.

The Public Health Department is working closely with elected officials and department heads to continue taking the appropriate steps to keep their employees and the public safe. Constituents are asked to continue to conduct business online by going through the County's website at <https://www.cameroncounty.us/>.

"A year ago to date, our daily COVID-19 case counts were on the rise and reached four digits beginning August. Our area hospitalizations were critical, and the need for the vaccines that would protect against this life-threatening disease was of immense need. Today, even though we are proud of the leading vaccination efforts throughout the entire State, we are yet to reach herd immunity and are unfortunately informing variants of the initial COVID-19 disease. Present data informs that those individuals testing positive are not inoculated. Please, I urge all to do what's right to help protect your loved ones from this ongoing threat. To all County employees, please continue to follow all health and sanitation protocols when out in public to prevent the spread of COVID-19 both at home and at work," stated Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr.
