**CAMERON COUNTY TO HOST PFIZER VACCINE CLINIC FOR  
CHILDREN AGES 5 TO 11 AT THE MARY P. LUCIO CLINIC ON  
SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 2021**

Cameron County Public Health will host a Pfizer Vaccine Clinic for children ages 5 to 11 on Saturday, November 6, 2021, at the Mary P. Lucio Clinic located at 1204 Jose Colunga Jr. St., Brownsville, TX from 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. Parents / guardians will have to fill out and sign a consent form that will be provided on site.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) announced the approval and recommendation that children between the ages of 5 and 11 years receive the Pfizer pediatric COVID-19 Vaccine. Most children and all teenagers qualify to receive the vaccine. Children and teenagers ages 5 through 17 are authorized to receive the Pfizer Vaccine, and individuals 18 years of age and older are authorized to receive the Pfizer, Moderna, or Johnson & Johnson Vaccine.

Cameron County joins local pediatric offices, pharmacies, and schools in offering vaccines for children countywide. Free Pfizer pediatric COVID-19 vaccines are available now at all Cameron County Public Health Clinics:
