**CAMERON COUNTY HAS PARTNERED WITH THE TEXAS A&M RGV ADVANCED  
MANUFACTURING HUB'S TRAIN PROGRAM TO PROVIDE ADVANCED  
WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT TRAINING & COURSES FREE OF CHARGE TO  
ALL CAMERON COUNTY EMPLOYEES**

Cameron County is excited to announce it has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the state's top engineering agencies - the Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station and the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service - to ensure their TRAIN program, a comprehensive, no-cost training program, is available to all Cameron County employees. In effort to further develop a workforce skilled in advance manufacturing techniques and to promote manufacturing in the region, TRAIN offers courses such as leadership development, professional skills, cybersecurity, heavy equipment operator, welding, occupational health and safety, COVID-19 protocols, and process improvement.

"We recognize that the future of Texas is our people, and more specifically, the people of South Texas," said John Sharp, chancellor of the Texas A&M University System. "That is why the Texas A&M System is so deeply dedicated to communities of the Rio Grande Valley and the TRAIN program."

TRAIN courses range from a few hours to a few weeks and include being taught in classrooms settings with hands-on involvement or online for convenience. Certificates of completion will be provided at the conclusion of each course. For course registration, employees must coordinate with their Department Head/Elected Official.
