The meeting was called to order by Judge Antonio O. Garza Jr. He then asked Mr. Rick Bennett, Los Indios resident, to lead the Court and the audience in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The Court considered the following matters as posted and filed for Record in the Office of the County Clerk on August 15, 1994, at 10:41 A. M.:

(1) **AUTHORIZATION TO CANVASS THE LOS INDIOS
INCORPORATION ELECTION OF AUGUST 13, 1994**

At this time, Judge Garza extended his appreciation to the members of the Community of Los Indios for the patience demonstrated, in order to make sure that the Incorporation efforts were done correctly and in the manner so as not to be challenged, and expressed his congratulations on the favorable election results.

He noted that once the canvassing of the votes were completed, Los Indios would be a duly incorporated City, within the Laws of the State of Texas, and that perhaps that would be when the many "truly big" challenges would begin.

He stated that he had "no doubts that if the Community persevered and worked as hard as was done throughout the Petition and Election process, that Los Indios would be a very successful Community".

Upon motion by Commissioner Rosenbaum, seconded by Commissioner Cascos and carried unanimously, the canvassing of the Los Indios Incorporation Election of August 13, 1994, was authorized.

At this time, Ms. Tencha de la Peña, Elections Administrator, reported that there were no changes in the canvassing of the Los Indios Incorporated Election results, that being one hundred fifty- two (152) total votes cast, with one hundred thirty-eight (138) "For" and fourteen (14) "Against".

Commissioner Cascos moved that the Canvassing Report of the Los Indios Incorporation Election be acknowledged.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Rosenbaum and carried unanimously.

The Report is as follows:

At this time, Mr. Rick Bennett, Los Indios Resident, extended the Community's appreciation to the Court for their support and assistance in their efforts for Incorporation. He added that he would not serve on any elected position, but would continue to serve in any "appointed" position.
